The vowels and consonants in the transliterated Greek should be sung as in Italian. Especially in the first part of the piece, each part usually only sings one syllable of a word, with entries staggered so that the entire word is sung. I have used hyphens and punctuation to indicate these "orphan" syllables (i.e. for the word "Wanassa," "Wa-" is the first syllable; "-nas-" is the second; and "-sa." is the third).
